THE COMMUNION RITE

15TH DECEMBER 2024

Through the words and actions of the priest God touches those gifts of bread and wine with the power of the Holy Spirit and transfigures those gifts into the Body and Blood of Christ. When we finish the Eucharistic Prayer and move into what is the Communion Rite, the sacrifice becomes the feast. The altar of sacrifice now becomes the table of the feast. God sits down with us and shares the feast with us to seal the bond of communion from which the sacrifices come.



We begin that moment by praying the Lord's Prayer. Again, we have

no words of our own to bring. We have no gifts of our own to bring. The words that we have to bring to this moment of the feast are words which Jesus Himself has given.

Then we pray the prayer: deliver us Lord from every evil. In the midst of all of that we ask God to give us the peace that comes from God saving us from sin and distress as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour. So that again we're focused on past, present and future.

Once we've prayed the Lord's Prayer we pray for peace. The peace which only God can give. We pray for peace as we come to share the feast and then we share the peace with each other which is also peace with God. If appropriate we share with each other the sign of the peace.

The sign of peace is not just another handshake or wishing each other well, it's recognising the truth of who we have become because of what God has done and we recognise that same truth in others.

After the sign of Peace, the priest takes the host into which the Spirit of God has been breathed and which has become the Body of Christ, and he breaks the host. And one of the oldest names for Mass or the Eucharist was 'the breaking of the bread'. But this bread is no longer just bread. When we break it, we're saying that the body of Jesus was broken for us or, as we say, for the life of the world. The bread must be broken in order to be shared by everyone. If it's not broken it cannot be shared. Similarly, the body of Jesus had to be broken on the cross for the whole world to be fed with the life of God, which is our true life.

Once the host is broken the priest will hold up the body of Christ and the chalice which is the blood of Christ and say: "Behold the Lamb of God...". This language takes us way back into the book of Exodus, the story of the liberation of the slaves from Egypt where they ate the lamb of the Passover. Jesus is the Lamb and the feast, the lamb of the feast that we are about to share.

The Communion Rite comes to its high point when finally we come to receive what God provides. As we receive the host, the priest says 'the Body of Christ'. When we say 'Amen' we're saying yes I believe that this is the body of the crucified and risen Christ but we're also saying that we believe that we are a part of the body of Christ and that we share the feast as a single body.
