CARFIN GROTTO

In the words of Bishop Devine: "Carfin Grotto is a holy place, made holy by the many thousands of good people who come to it each year". Thomas Nimmo Taylor first visited Lourdes in 1893 when he was a student for the priesthood at the seminary of St Sulpice in Paris, perhaps the first of many Scottish pilgrims who were still to come.

In 1920 Fr Taylor led a group of pilgrims from his parish of St Francis Xavier's, Carfin to the shrine at Lourdes and they returned with one firm purpose in mind: they would build a small replica of the Grotto of Lourdes at Carfin. An acre of waste ground belonging to the parish was chosen as the site for this project and parishioners joined enthusiastically in the task of preparing the



land. Many of those who worked on the building of the Grotto were miners, who were idle owing to the 1921 strike. Many helpers also came from the surrounding parishes and finally on Sunday, 1st October 1922 the Grotto was opened and dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes.

In 1924 the Grotto was extended to cater for the crowds who came in increasing numbers to Carfin. Crowds as large as 50,000 were reported in the press when, for example, Cardinal Bourne of Westminster came to the shrine. In Carfin there had sprung up a strong devotion to St Therese of the Child Jesus when she was canonised in 1925 and a beautiful statue was erected in her honour. Over the years many other statues and shrines have been added to the Grotto.

In 1989 the glass chapel built for the Glasgow Garden Festival was purchased and re-sited in the Grotto as the Chapel of Our Lady, the Maid of the Seas. Inscribed in this chapel are the names of all those who lost their lives in the devastating Lockerbie disaster.

The Second World War resulted in the settlement in Scotland of many exiles from Central and Eastern Europe and many of these were from Poland. Their strong witness to their faith makes them a very valuable part of the life of the diocese. Each year they gather at Carfin around the beautiful shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa to celebrate their national day.

The first Lithuanians to come to Scotland in 1884 were prisoners from the Crimean War. They were followed by others, who left their farms in Lithuania, to work in the coalmines and steelworks of Mossend, Bellshill, Holytown and Carfin. In the Marian Year of 1988 the Lithuanian shrine to Our Lady was rebuilt in the Grotto, the shrine also displays a wooden cross with a statue of their patron, St Casimir.

Ukraine and Scotland have one important thing in common - our patron saint, Andrew. The Ukrainian shrine depicts Kyiv cathedral bound in chain and barbed wire. The Palestinian state is represented in the beautiful statue of Our Lady of Palestine, the Irish people, especially those who perished in the Great Famine, are represented in the statue of St Patrick and the Mass Rock, where Mass was celebrated during the times of persecution.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

3rd September - Memoria of St Gregory the Great - St Gregory the Great was born in 540 of a noble Roman family, he had been Prefect of the city and then became a monk. He was sent as papal ambassador to Constantinople for three years. In 590 he was called to be Bishop of Rome. His work rightly earned him the sobriquet 'Great'. He was an excellent administrator and organised in areas of doctrine and liturgy, as well as in disciplinary matters. He is known in England as the pope who sent St Augustine to Canterbury. Pope Gregory was a preacher, an author, a homilist, an exegete, a theologian, a correspondent. He died in 604 and is honoured as the patron saint of musicians and teachers.

5th September - Memoria of St Teresa of Calcutta - St Teresa of Calcutta was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Albania, her father died when she was nine years old. Moved to be a missionary Agnes entered the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland, and departed for Calcutta in 1929. She taught for a number of years, and, as a result of mystical experiences, Teresa felt called by Christ to establish a religious community, Missionaries of Charity, dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor. Teresa and her sisters reached out to the poor with love on the streets of Calcutta wearing the distinctive, blue trimmed white sari. The Missionaries of Charity are active in every continent. Mother Teresa was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She died in 1997.
