THE ALTAR CANDLES

Candles play an important part in Catholic worship of God. They adorn the altar, they stand by the ambo (lectern), you hold them as acolytes, people light them in front of the Blessed Sacrament or a statue or shrine.

Whenever the Blessed Sacrament is in the tabernacle a special candle, the Sanctuary Lamp, always burns close by. The Easter Vigil starts with the lighting of the Easter Fire and the blessing and lighting of the Paschal Candle as the priest prays "May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds"- it is carried into a



darkened church and the risen Christ is again proclaimed to be our light as people light their own candles from it. It remains lit at all liturgical celebrations during the Easter Season and at baptisms and funerals throughout the year.

Candles are required for the celebration of the Mass. They are used at every liturgical service – at baptisms, penance services, marriages, funerals, vespers, benediction, etc. as a sign of the dignity and festiveness of the celebration. Their light signifies Christ – the light of the world. Their gradual burning down as the wax is consumed serves as a sign of Christ's self-sacrifice in the service of His mission.

The number of candles used does have a significance. Their varying number is a good way of marking the various days and celebrations of the Church's year. Two candles are usually used for feria days (when no feast is being celebrated) and memorias, the two candles speaks to us of the two natures of Christ - human and divine. Four candles are used for feast days and six candles are used on Sundays, solemnities and important celebrations.

When the diocesan bishop celebrates Mass on an important occasion like the Sacrament of Confirmation an odd number of candles, seven, are placed on the altar. This is to signify the completeness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders represented by the presence of the bishop.

The use of candles reminds us of the early Christians who celebrated the Mass in the dark of the catacombs. We also use acolyte candles carried by servers at Solemn and High Masses, to accompany the processional cross and the procession of the Book of the Gospels.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which governs what happens during Mass, states: "The candlesticks required for the different liturgical services for reasons of reverence or the festive character of the celebration should be appropriately placed either on the altar or around it, according to the design of the altar and the sanctuary, so that the whole may be harmonious and the faithful may not be impeded from a clear view of what takes place at the altar or what is placed upon it. Likewise, either on the altar or near it, there is to be a cross, with the figure of Christ crucified upon it, a cross clearly visible to the assembled people."

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

30th September - Memoria of St Jerome - St Jerome was born around 342 and became an ascetic and a scholar, ordained priest at Antioch in 379, he went to Constantinople where he and St Gregory Nazianzen became friends. In 382 he moved to Rome, becoming secretary to Pope Damasus and being known for his sanctity, learning and eloquence. He chose to live in Bethlehem in 386 and to complete his writings: letters, treatises, commentaries on Scripture and, especially, the 'Vulgate' translation of the Bible into Latin. He is honoured as a Father of the Church. He died in 420 and is the patron saint of translators and librarians.

1st October - Memoria of St Therese of Lisieux - St Therese was born in Alençon in Normandy in 1873, she was permitted to enter the nearby Lisieux Carmel in her mid-teens. Not of robust health, she practised humility, simplicity and trust in God. In her autobiographical *Histoire d'une âme*, she writes of her 'Little Way' by which ordinary and insignificant people can be saints through a childlike approach to God. She died in 1897, was canonised a saint in 1925, a patron saint of France in 1947 and a Doctor of the Church in 1997.

2nd October - Memoria of the Guardian Angels - We know that angels exist from Sacred Scripture. Without being too specific regarding details, the Church teaches that God assigns an angel or angels to guard us during our life on earth. This belief illustrates God's providential care for each of us.

4th October - Memoria of St Francis of Assisi - Born in 1181, the son of a rich Assisi merchant, at 24 he gave up his opulent lifestyle and devoted himself to care for the sick and the poor, giving up his inheritance and choosing to live as a hermit. By 1219 his new band of brothers, becoming known as Franciscans, had reached 5000 in number. He visited Egypt in 1223 and preached before the Muslim Sultan, from this came the special privileges the Franciscans have, called the 'Custody' of the Holy Land, being guardians of the great sites associated with the Lord's life, death and resurrection. Through his example and advice, St Clare founded the Franciscan way for women, the Poor Clares. He was also the first to introduce crib scenes in churches. He died in 1226. He is the patron saint of the environment and animals.

UPDATE OF WORKS TO PARISH PROPERTIES

- The cellar roof, gutters and lead of the hall were repaired a few weeks ago costing $\pounds1,800.00$, paid for by the Parish Hall account.
- The Parish Hall entrance door, patio doors and cellar doors have been in desperate need of repair for a while now, this will cost around $\pounds3,000.00$, again being paid for by the Parish Hall account.
