THE AMBO

The Church teaches that at the Mass the people of God are served from two tables: the table of the word and the table of the sacrament. From both these tables the faithful of God receive Christ himself, present in the word proclaimed and in the bread that has become his Body and the wine that has become his Blood. It is therefore important when the Holy Scriptures are read everything be done to help make it clear to those present that these words we hear are the living word of God.

There are many ways in which the importance of the word is emphasised. Special ministers are trained and commissioned for the ministry of proclaiming God's word. The word is proclaimed only from books of dignity and beauty. We respond to the readings by affirming that this is indeed the word of the Lord and offering our thanks to God for his word. When the reading is from the Gospels we mark the especial dignity of this word in additional ways - we stand and sing our Gospel Acclamation; we trace the



sign of the cross on our forehead, lips and heart, to indicate our desire to take this word to heart, to ponder its meaning, and to carry its message to the world. Sometimes we use candles and lights to further emphasise the significance that this reading has for us.

Of particular importance in establishing the importance that the word of God has for the Church is the ambo. This should normally be fixed and not simply a moveable lectern. The material and design of the ambo should themselves point to the permanence and beauty of God's saving word. The dignity of the word of God requires that the church have a place that is suitable for the proclamation of the word and toward which the attention of the whole congregation of the faithful naturally turns during the Liturgy of the Word. In the same way that the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist are so closely related as to make up one act of worship, so it is appropriate that there be an evident relationship between the ambo and the altar. Sometimes this is achieved through their being made from the same materials.

The dignity of the ambo requires that only a minister of the word should make use of it. The ambo is used exclusively for the proclamation of God's word, including the singing of the responsorial psalm; the breaking open of the word in the Homily and general intercessions; and also the Easter proclamation (Exsultet). The ambo should not be used for announcements etc.

The ambo should reflect the dignity and nobility of the message proclaimed from it. The key word here is "proclaimed". The Word of God is not the printed text in a book. It is those words spoken by the reader, deacon or priest. It is something alive and active. Our reverence for the Word of God is expressed in the reverence that we pay to the Book of the Gospels and the Lectionary – the priest or deacon proclaiming the Gospel will kiss the passage he has read when he finishes. It is only right that this should be expressed in the design and placement of the ambo.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

7th October - Memoria of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary - The feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary was instituted in thanksgiving for the naval victory of the 'Holy League' (of Catholic nations led by Don John of Austria) over the ships of the Ottoman Empire in 1571 at Lepanto (off the coast of Greece). Nowadays, the feast is a special day in the month of the Holy Rosary, the prayer that allows us to meditate on the mysteries of Jesus, whose life was so closely associated with Mary.

9th October - Optional Memoria of St Denis - St Denis, sent from Rome around 250 to preach the gospel to the Gauls, was the first bishop of Paris and, by tradition, the apostle of France. The Roman governor had him arrested, tried and, with two other Christians (Rusticus and Eleutherius), tortured and beheaded. The saint's remains are in the basilica of Saint Denis formerly an abbey church, now a cathedral, where many of the kings and queens of France are buried. He is the patron saint of those who are troubled by headaches.

11th October - Optional Memoria of St John XXIII - Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born in 1881 of a peasant family in Sotto il Monte, near Bergamo. Ordained in 1904 and a chaplain in World War I, later he was apostolic delegate in Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece and, in 1944, Nuncio to Paris. Patriarch of Venice in 1953, he was elected Pope in 1958. Soon after, he convened the Second Vatican Council. He was known as 'Good Pope John' and died in 1963, during the Second Vatican Council. He is the patron saint of the Italian Army and Papal Delegates.

POPE FRANCIS FAITH AWARD

The Bishops Conference of Scotland instituted The Pope Francis Faith Award programme to help young people in Scotland's Catholic schools to see and feel for themselves the benefits of acting with love, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The award is designed to help children to show 'signs of love' in their daily lives and to be active members of their local parish.

It invites young people in Primary 6 and 7 to use the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and to see how they can bear fruit in their homes, schools and parishes. It is directly connected to what young people are learning about the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Each year our senior pupils take part in the Pope Francis Faith Award, learning about each gift in turn, reflecting on it and then deciding how to act on it. By the end of Primary 7, pupils work towards achieved accreditation. Pupils who play an active part in their parish life can also be awarded a Parish Commendation which is verified by their Parish Priest.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE 2025

For our 2025 Parish Pilgrimage, rather than Rome we are looking at two alternative options. These two options are: Tuscany with trips to Florence/Pisa/Cinque Terre, or, Padua with trips to Lake Garda/Milan. It is unfortunate that a pilgrimage to Rome is proving to be so difficult but airlines and hotels have increased their prices due to the Holy Year. If you would be interested in either option please let Fr Wyllie know as soon as possible. October 2025 is the most probable time.

MISSION SUNDAY
