ST PETER & ST PAUL

30TH JUNE 2024

Simon was born in Bethsaida, near the Sea of Galilee. He was a fisherman by trade, along with his brother Andrew. Matthew's Gospel records that Simon and Andrew were the first whom Jesus invited to follow Him. At that, these two brothers dropped everything and became Jesus' first disciples. John's Gospel relates a slightly different timeline, stating that Andrew first followed Jesus and brought Simon to Jesus the next day. When Jesus met Simon, He said, "'You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas (which is translated Peter)" (John 1:42). Matthew's Gospel relates that Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter when He said to him, "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall never prevail against it. I will



give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:18–19).

With his new name and unique spiritual authority in which he held the "keys to the kingdom of heaven," Peter emerged as the central leader of the Church after Pentecost. He spent about a decade in Jerusalem, preaching powerfully, performing miracles, and converting many. He eventually travelled to Rome where he established the Church there, becoming its first bishop. Around the year 64, he was martyred during the persecutions of Emperor Nero. His tomb is located under the main altar of Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City.

Saul was born as a Roman citizen in Tarsus, modern-day Turkey. As a young man, he went to Jerusalem to study at the renowned school of the rabbi Gamaliel. After Jesus' ascension into Heaven, Saul became one of the fiercest persecutors of the early Church, being partly responsible for the death of the proto-martyr Saint Stephen (Acts 7:58). However, within a few years, as Saul was traveling to Damascus to persecute other Christians, he was knocked to the ground and struck blind. He heard Jesus say to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" (Acts 9:4). Jesus then directed him to a disciple of the Lord in Damascus named Ananias who baptised Saul. Saul spent about three years in Arabia then Damascus and Jerusalem.

In Jerusalem, Saul began to use his Roman name, Paul, and then spent approximately the next ten years as a missionary throughout the Mediterranean. Back in Jerusalem, he was imprisoned for a couple of years and then was sent to Rome for trial since he was a Roman citizen. In Rome, he met up with Saint Peter. According to tradition, Paul was beheaded just outside the city of Rome. The incredible Basilica of St Pauls Outside the Walls is his burial place.

Saints Peter and Paul are considered the foundational pillars of the Church. Peter represents the stability of the Church and the office of the Vicar of Christ (the Pope). Paul represents the mission of evangelisation that was entrusted to the Church by Jesus Himself. He was also the Church's first theologian, which is seen in his numerous letters that expound on the Gospels.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

3rd July - Feast of St Thomas - St Thomas "called the Twin" was the Apostle who encouraged the others to go with Jesus to Judaea "and die with him" and whose questioning elicits Our Lord's response: "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life". Famously he is Doubting Thomas but who eventually addresses the Risen Jesus as "My Lord and my God", the Easter Faith of the Church. Tradition has him taking the Faith to Kerala in India in the year 52 and being martyred near Chennai in the year 72. He is the patron of architects and judges.

4th July - Optional Memoria of St Elizabeth of Portugal - St Elizabeth of Portugal was born in 1271, a Spanish princess, and given in marriage to King Denis of Portugal. From her earliest days she had established a strong daily timetable of prayer. She used her position to found institutions to help the poor and needy. King Denis was well-known to be unfaithful, and she suffered much, but he later repented and she helped him die a good death. After he died she took on the habit of the Third Order of St Francis, continuing her life of prayer and charitable work. The Portuguese call her "The Peacemaker" for her strenuous efforts to reconcile warring factions. She once rode a mule between opposing armies of her husband and son, to stop a civil war. She died in 1336 and is honoured as the patron saint of brides, widows, charitable societies, charitable workers, charities and difficult marriages.

5th July - Optional Memoria of St Anthony Zaccaria - St Anthony Zaccaria was born in 1502 in Lombardy of well-to-do parents, but his mother made sure he experienced the poorer sections of society. He studied to become a doctor but later went into the Priesthood. He founded the Barnabites to promote the writing of St Paul and encouraged the Forty Hours Adoration. He is the patron saint of physicians.

6th July - Optional Memoria of St Maria Goretti - St Maria Goretti was born in 1890 into a poor farming family, Because of their poverty, they had to share a house with the Serenelli family, at Nettuno, south of Rome. Alessandro Serenelli, aged 20, made persistent approaches which she always resisted, being a prayerful and spiritual girl. Her refusal on the final occasion led to a frenzied attack with an awl (a pointed tool for piercing holes, especially in leather). She died at the age of 11, the next day, forgiving her attacker. He was sentenced to 30 years in prison, unrepentant. Maria appeared to him while in prison, offering him flowers. This changed him, and on his release his first act was to visit Maria's mother and ask forgiveness. St Maria Goretti is the patron saint of chastity, rape victims, girls, youth, teenage girls, poverty, purity, and forgiveness.

FULL LICENSE FOR THE PARISH HALL

On Friday 21st June the Parish Hall was successful in gaining a full bar license. This will enable the Hall to take bookings at short notice particularly when it comes to Funeral Teas etc. The Parish Hall is now licensed from 11.00am until midnight each day of the week, so we are in a position to accommodate most requests for the use of the hall. NEW LECTIONARIES

WHAT IS HAPPENING AND WHY?

The Lectionary (the books we use to proclaim the Word of God in our Masses and other liturgies) is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued to work through all the other liturgical rites.

WHAT TRANSLATION WILL THE NEW LECTIONARY USE?

The new Lectionary will be using the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition of the Bible, and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms.

WHAT EFFECT WILL THE CHANGES HAVE ON THE MASS READINGS?

The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical settings that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive.

WHEN WILL THE CHANGES TAKE PLACE?

The new Lectionary will come into force on the First Sunday of Advent 2024.

CAN PARISHES KEEP USING THE OLD LECTIONARY?

No, parishes will need to change over to the new Lectionary on 1st December 2024.

WHAT IS THE COST?

The Ambo Edition is the standard Lectionary for parishes. Exquisitely bound in padded leather, and adorned with gold-blocking, gilded edges and multiple ribbon markers (pictured above), these four volumes are both sturdy and worthy for the proclamation of the Word of God.

Each set of four books which are needed will cost \pounds 695. We will need two sets, one for St Mary's & one for Our Lady & St John's, so total cost \pounds 1,390.00.

We will also need two Study Editions, smaller books, for use in our two schools or in Masses in other places such a Nursing Homes, parishioners houses etc. Each set will cost £250.00, so a total of £500.00 for those.

The Book of the Gospels will also need to be changed, this will cost £275.00.

COULD YOU SPONSOR A BOOK IN MEMORY OF A LOVED ONE OR IN THANKSGIVING?

If you are able to sponsor a single Lectionary, at a cost of $\pounds 175$ each, a memorial book plate will be placed in each book to record your name or family name in each book, or the name of a deceased loved one.
