FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

9th September - Memoria of St Peter Claver - St Peter Claver was born in 1580 in Catalonia and, becoming a Jesuit, went to Latin America and specifically Columbia as his place of mission. For thirty-three years he worked among slaves, often going on board the ships as they arrived from Africa, their human cargo terrified, weak, starving and very sick. He showed care and compassion for them and gave them religious instruction. He is said to have baptised more that 300,000 slaves as well as offering them the other sacraments. He ensured the Christian slaves received their Christian and civil rights. He also evangelised the sailors and traders too. He died in 1654 and is the patron saint of African Americans and enslaved people.

12th September - Memoria of the Most Holy Name of Mary - The name of Mary is regarded as holy because it is the name of the Mother of God, her who brought the Saviour into the world. The Feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary was added to the Universal Calendar in 1684 by Blessed Pope Innocent XI, commemorating the defeat of the Turks as they tried to invade Europe through Vienna: a powerful example of the might of the Blessed Virgin Mary's intercession.

13th September - Memoria of St John Chrysostom - St John Chrysostom was born in 347. The adjective 'Chrysostom' by which he was known means 'golden mouthed', i.e., eloquent. He trained as an advocate but, after six years as a monk, took holy orders - deacon, priest and, in 398, Archbishop of Constantinople (modern day Istanbul). He built hospitals, reformed the clergy, sent monks to be missionaries and, for criticising the vices of the rulers of Constantinople, was deposed and banished in 403. Still in exile, he died for years later in 407. He was reburied honourably in Constantinople in 418. He is the patron of preachers.

14th September - Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross - The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates the rescue of the relic of the True Cross by Emperor Heraclius in 629 after it had been captured by the Persians; it also marks the original dedication of the Church of the Holt Sepulchre, where relics of the Cross were kept, in 335. The Feast celebrates the Cross, the instrument of our salvation. The Cross is a great and powerful sign of God's love for us - a love stronger than death - and also a daily reality in our lives: the only true path to holiness. We pray for the staff and pupils of Holy Cross High School on this day.
