# VISIT OF THE PAPAL NUNCIO

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Pope's Ambassador to Great Britain, the Papal Nuncio, has graciously accepted my invitation to visit our Diocese. Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendia will be present with us from the evening of Friday 30th August until his return to London on Monday 2nd September. I ask you to join with me in welcoming him, particularly at the Masses he will celebrate with us. These are as follows:

## FRIDAY 30TH AUGUST AT 7.00PM

This will be a Solemn Mass of Welcome in Our Lady of Good Aid Cathedral, celebrating the communion of the Diocese in

the Universal Church led by our Holy Father, the Pope. I have already invited the clergy to attend and encouraged them to nominate some parishioners to come so that each parish feels included. The invitation to this and the other Masses is extended to all of you, so please feel welcome to attend the Mass and the reception afterwards in St Bride's Centre. (All parishioners are invited to attend this Mass to represent our parish)

## SATURDAY 31ST AUGUST AT 10.00AM

Archbishop Buendia will celebrate the Saturday morning Mass in honour of Our Lady, Fountain of Salvation, and its particular focus will be to pray for the continued progress of Project Wellspring, the Motherwell programme for pastoral renewal. I propose we make this Saturday morning Mass for the whole of the Diocese. It is particularly hoped that those who are involved in Wellspring in the parishes and in the diocesan missions will attend this Mass and come afterwards to St Bride's Centre for a presentation on Wellspring and discussion on its development. This is scheduled to last from 11.30am until 2.30pm and will include lunch. I have asked that four people from each parish accompany the parish clergy. **(Members of Project Wellspring Working Group are invited)** 

## SUNDAY 1ST SEPTEMBER AT 3.00PM

His Excellency will be the main celebrant at the National Pilgrimage Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto at Carfin. The them for the Pilgrimage this year is Pilgrims of Prayer, in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. Bishop Frank Dougan of Galloway will be the homilist. Everybody is most welcome to attend. **(Bus leaves Blackwood at 1.15pm; Larkhall at 1.30pm)** 

I realise that to have three special Masses on consecutive days is quite demanding but I hope that you will be able to participate and ensure that we give a very special welcome to our Papal Nuncio and assure him of our loyalty to, and our supportive prayers for, Our Holy Father.

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**27th August - Memoria of St Monica -** St Monica was born around 332, a North African Catholic woman whose prayers, pleading and example helped both her husband Patricius and her son Augustine to be converted and baptised. Augustine was in Milan, where Monica went and saw him baptised. They were on their way back from the baptism to Africa when Monica fell ill and died at Ostia, the then port of Rome, in 387. Her long and patient efforts and prayers for her husband and son are a model and inspiration to encourage many wives, mothers and grandmothers today. She is the patron of alcoholics, victims of abuse and adultery, widows, and mothers facing family difficulties.

**28th August - Memoria of St Augustine** - This great saint was born to Patricius and Monica in Northern Africa (in present day Algeria) in 354. Extremely intelligent, he crossed to Europe as a young man and, after a short time in Rome, went to Milan. He had a brilliant career there, but still unbaptised, also lived a rather dissolute life. He fathered Adeodatus who died at a young age. Encouraged by the presence of his mother, Augustine received baptism and returned, a committed Catholic, to North Africa. Such was his renown that he was made bishop of the city of Hippo. An outstanding writer and preacher, his books and sermons became (and still are) extremely influential in the Church. He died in 430. He is patron of brewers, printers, theologians.

**29th August - Memoria of the Passion of St John the Baptist** - The Gospels relate how St John the Baptist fearlessly condemned Herod Antipas's unlawful marriage to Herodias, who had been previously married to his half-brother. The outraged Herodias had him imprisoned. In a moment of weakness Herod promised to grant the heart's desire of Salome, the daughter of Herodias. She asked for the head of St John the Baptist on a dish, he was killed and his head presented to her.

**31st August - Optional Memoria of St Aidan** - St Aidan was an Irish monk who joined the community at Iona and was sent to preach the Gospel in Northumbria. He was consecrated bishop and settled on the island of Lindisfarne, with the support of King St Oswald and his successor St Oswin. After St Aidan's death in 651, Lindisfarne continued to produce many saints.
